Reconfirmation Meeting for November 17, 2020

Reconfirm instructional delivery method:

Early Childhood – Hybrid (synchronous daily time option, recorded materials, print based), 8/9 ECSE programs have been moved to remote learning only secondary to LEA shifting to remote only option

Center Based Program – Contingency Learning Plans for remote (recorded lessons, live meeting time options, access to printed materials) These programs went remote on November 16, 2020 and will go back to face to face on January 4, 2021.

Youth Center – Face to Face (but a temporary suspension of in person learning from 11/9-11/20) All remote through 12/8/2020.

MCMC – Several options - Live, synchronous instruction (with Remote and Asynchronous Wednesdays beginning November 2nd through the end of 1st semester) or Virtual, asynchronous instruction. Beginning on November 18th through December 8th, the MCMC will be providing remote, live instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and Wednesdays would be remote, asynchronous instruction.

Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level:

Early Childhood: Hybrid with 2 days in person, 2 days remote (on remote dates - synchronous daily time option, recorded materials, print based); 6/9 ECSE programs have been moved to remote learning only secondary to LEA shifting to remote only option; live daily lessons, teacher support office hours, and pre-recorded lessons with distributed learning materials will be utilized to provide remote educational learning experiences

Center Based Program: Contingency Learning Plans for remote (recorded lessons, live meeting time options, access to printed materials, and live lessons, small group and individual learning opportunities). These programs went remote on November 16, 2020 and will go back to face to face on January 4, 2021.

Youth Center: Face to Face (temporary suspension of in person learning from 11/9-11/20 resulted in daily live lessons, 1:1 teacher support) All remote through 12/8/2020.

Monroe County Middle College: There are three different options for the MCMC students. Option 1 is live, synchronous instruction with 2 days face-to-face, 2 days of distance learning, and 1 day of remote, asynchronous instruction. Cohort A attended Mondays and Tuesdays face-to-face in September and were face-to-face on Mondays – Wednesdays in October. On the days they were not face-to-face, they connected to their classes every day through Zoom to receive live, synchronous instruction. Cohort B attended Wednesdays – Fridays face-to-face in September and are face-to-face on Thursdays and Fridays in October. On the days students are not face-to-face, they connect to their classes through Zoom to receive live, synchronous instruction. Option 2 is where the students are distant and are connecting to their classes every day via Zoom for live, synchronous instruction. For options 1 and 2, beginning on November 2, 2020 through the end of 1st semester - Both Cohort A and B will have Remote Wednesdays of asynchronous instruction. Option 3 is where students are virtual and are receiving asynchronous instruction that they can access any time, any place, anywhere via Edgenuity. Beginning on November 18th through December 8th, the MCMC will be providing remote, live instruction on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays and Wednesdays would be remote, asynchronous instruction. Out of the 364 students at the MCMC, 85% are face-to-face, 11% are distance, 4% are virtual.

Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:

Yes, the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, and other special populations. As of 11/16/2020, in person learning has been suspended until January 4, 2021. Remote learning opportunities will include translation for English language learners and will continue to provide high quality instruction for students with special education programs and services through remote platforms.
