Build a Program focused on QUALITY:

- Eliminate financial barriers to becoming a teacher trained for free & paid to do so
- Address the **substantial vacancies** particularly **early childhood** and **special education**
- Eliminate the concept of first year teacher: ensure classrooms receive teachers who are prepared to teach
- Improve educator diversity
- Serve the needs of rural and urban schools

Establish a **Registered Apprenticeship Program**:

- Establish on the job competencies work backward from existing evaluation and other tools
- Instruction aligned to quality materials and practices
- Competitive compensation



12 institutions applied and Talent Together selected 10 partners to offer more affordable, flexible options for teacher candidates.


























Structures of Talent Together - Phase 1 Development

How is Talent Together Different from Other GYO Programs?

Talent Together is a <u>state-wide educator talent initiative</u> and a <u>hub</u> for teacher and teacher leader development. Talent Together will provide:

- A federally Registered Apprenticeship Program that provides entry-points for candidates with or without degrees
- Candidate accessibility and options to enroll in EPP-based programs that historically have been geographically out of reach
- A consortium-based staff including regional program and recruitment directors, instructional coaches, and operational support
- Opportunities for experienced teachers to earn teacher leader credentials and advance their careers



What is a Registered Apprenticeship Program? (RAP)

Registered Apprenticeship Programs (RAPs) are approved and validated by the U.S. Department of Labor or a State Apprenticeship Agency. RAPs provide:

- Industry-driven, high-quality career pathways
- Learn and earn preparation models that include paid work experience and progressive wage increases
- Access to federal and state workforce development funds that cannot be accessed by existing teacher preparation programs in Michigan

There are currently no approved Registered Apprenticeship Programs for teaching in Michigan. Talent Together is actively working with the US Department of Labor (DOL) and the MI DOL team for approval as a Registered Apprenticeship Program.
